What does it mean to be an Anglican Church in the 21st century? For Alstonville Anglicans, a 21st century Anglican Church knows there is "no one size fits all". We thus implemented diverse worshipping communities that each have a distinctive style of worship and "flavour" of spirituality, supported by empowering leadership and good governance.

Anam Cara on a Wednesday and Contemplative Church on a Thursday offers a meditative experience of worship. Fridays at 10 am and St Peter and St Paul's are traditional Anglican services. Sundays at 8am offers innovative tradition using contemporary liturgy. At 4pm we focus on families. 6pm on Sundays is about experimental, emerging worship that offers discussion, teaching and creative worship.

How is all this working?

We promised that we would review our mission plan with you and would appreciate it if you could offer us your stories. A handout will be available next week.

People ask 60 Minutes creator Don Hewitt the secret of his success. His answer? Tell me a story. Our stories offer clues to God's purpose in our lives.

That is why the heart of our church's review process will be the telling and hearing of our stories. The recurring themes that arise from these stories will then be summarized. These themes will give us guiding clues as to where God is at work and our strategy will be to join God there.

What type of questions might we ask? For example, one invitation could be.....

Tell me a story of a time in the last 12 months when you have felt energized and enlivened by your worship service/community. This is time when you felt most alive, most involved, spiritually touched, or most excited about your involvement.

The Gospel according to Luke 21:5-19

⁵ When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, Jesus said, 6 "As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down." 7 They asked him, "Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?" 8 And he said, "Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, Tam he! and, The time is near! Do not go after them. 9 "When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately." 10 Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; 11 there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. 12 "But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. 12 This will give you an opportunity to testify. 14 So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance; 15 for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to with stand or contradict. 16 You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. 17 You will be hated by all because of my name. 18 But not a hair of your head will perish. 19 By your endurance you will gain your souls.
